BARNEGAT BAY — Cliff Lewis Mantoloking, won the Horace Doan Trophy for E Sloops in Wigwam II and Dennis Wright, Bay Head, sailed Elsie to a first place to win the Franklin Doan Trophy for B Slopsmen in highlight the sailboat races here yesterday.

Leslie was the winner in the A Snarkboat race, skippered by Charles Bartley of Bay Head. Bob Beattie, Bay Head, brought Pine Dream in second, and third place went to Doveski with Brenda Bachman, Lavallette, as the skipper.
