INSTRUCTION AND RACING RULES

The 1965 Edition (Rev. 1968) of the By-Laws and Racing Rules of B.B.Y.R.A. shall cover all races held under the jurisdiction of the association unless otherwise specified.

Bulletin Board — The Regatta Committee will maintain in the vicinity of the registration desk an official Bulletin Board upon which will be posted important information, announcements and notices of protests. Sailors should check it frequently.

Safety Equipment — It shall be the sole responsibility of the skipper of each yacht to decide whether or not to start or continue to race. All yachts must carry safety equipment as specified by their class, which shall include not less than a paddle, bucket or pump, anchor and line, and one U.S.C.G. approved life preserver for each member of the crew. In addition to the above, it is the responsibility of the skipper and crew in all classes to wear vest-type non-inflatable life jackets whenever conditions warrant whether or not Code Flag "D" (yellow and blue bar) is displayed. When Code Flag "D" is displayed with two guns or horns prior to the preparatory signal or at any mark of the course during the race, skippers and crews of all classes shall wear such life jackets throughout the race. All yachts are subject to inspection and disqualification for failure to carry specified equipment or to wear non-inflatable vest-type life jackets when Code Flag "D" is displayed.

Any skipper withdrawing from a race without prompt notice to the Regatta Committee or one of the regatta patrol boats flying a patrol flag, shall, upon notification by the Regatta Committee to the Regatta Committee Representative of the skipper's club, be disqualified for the next two races. The skipper, however, shall have the right to appeal within three (3) days to the Regatta Committee, which committee, should it affirm the disqualification, shall have the right to increase or decrease the penalty. The appellant shall have the right to continue to race pending decision by the committee.

In order to qualify for championship, a yacht must be classified as a starter in the last two season races and in all but two (Lightnings, "E" Sloops, Comets, Jets — three) races of those scheduled for her class, except that when a yacht or skipper represents the B.B.Y.R.A. in any of the N.A.Y.R.U. sponsored National Championships or eliminations thereto, the elimination and final events of Olympic Games, or the finals of a National Class Championship provided that qualification thereto has been established by class elimination or, in the absence thereof, he has been selected as one out of six qualifiers, two out of ten qualifiers, or three out of more than ten qualifiers in that B.B.Y.R.A. Class Championship as of eight days prior to the date on which the cut is desired. In that event, the skipper or yacht may be granted one additional cut at the discretion of the Regatta Committee. This additional cut may be allowed in any of the season's races. Each request for action by the Regatta Committee shall be in writing and shall include all pertinent details. The request must be received by the Chairman of the Regatta Committee at least fifteen days prior to the date on which the cut is desired.

The B.B.Y.R.A. Championship for the "E" Sloop class shall be determined in accordance with B.B.Y.R.A. June, 1965 Racing Rules, B. Scoring, Pages 19-20, except that the lowest score of each yacht in any of the qualifying races will be discarded prior to the final determination of its percentage. In no case will any yacht qualify for championship unless it has started in at least nine races.

Skippers of national class association yachts are required to be members in good standing in their respective class organizations.

An entrance fee of Two Dollars (\$2.00) will be charged in each race of the championship series for all classes except Junior Classes, in which case a fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) will be charged. Junior Classes are "B" Sneakboxes, Junior Penguins, Intermediate Penguins and Jr. Comets.

A Yacht intending to enter a protest must display a Protest Flag — Code Flag B (Red) or B.B.Y.R.A. approved Protest Flag (Red) conspicuously in the rigging at the first reasonable opportunity and keep it flying until she has finished or retired. The protest must then be put in writing on forms provided by the Protest Committee and delivered to the Regatta Committee Chairman or his designee immediately after the race.

Class "A" Sneakboxes must conform with class specifications. Boats built after 1952 must have measurement certificates.

Class "B" Sneakboxes must be sailed by skipper and crew less than 16 years of age, must conform with class specifications and shall have a horizontal strip of black or red cloth, 12 inches long and 3 inches high, attached to both sides of the sail directly below the racing number. Boats built after 1952 must have measurement certificates.

Intermediate Penguins and Junior Comets must be sailed by a skipper and crew less than 18 years of age and must display an orange pennant on the roach of the sail or end of boom at least 2 inches by 10 inches.

"M" Sloops — The "M" Sloop fleet is divided into two classes, the "M" Sloop Morning Class and the "M" Sloop Afternoon Class. No "M" Sloop skipper competing in the Morning Class may compete as a skipper or crew (except as crew for an under 18 year old member of his or her family) in the Afternoon Class and vice versa. A skipper's first entry will commit him for the entire season. Any "M" Sloop may be sailed in any race of either series.

Junior Penguins must be sailed by a skipper and crew less than 15 years of age, and must display a green pennant on the roach of the sail or end of boom at least 2 inches by 10 inches.

Rooster Flags must be turned in before the next scheduled race or a deposit of Three Dollars (\$3.00) for its return will be required before entry will be accepted. Failure to return rooster the second race week will cause rejection of entry.

N.A.Y.R.U. SPONSORED NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS, MIDGET AND INTER-CLUB MATCH RACE CHAMPIONSHIPS

All member club entries in B.B.Y.R.A. elimination series for N.A.Y.R.U. sponsored National Championships, Midget and Inter-Club Match Race Championships must be forwarded via B.B.Y.R.A. Regatta Committee Representative. Only one entry per member club will be honored. It is the responsibility of each B.B.Y.R.A. Regatta Committee Representative forwarding an entry to insure the availability of a yacht in good racing condition. The entry shall name the yacht to be supplied.

O'DAY CUP. Finals to be sailed in Finns at Racine, Wisconsin, beginning July 30, 1968, to August 2. Semi-Finals to be sailed in Finns at the Ocean City Yacht Club on Margate waters under the auspices of the South Jersey Yacht Racing Association on July 16 and 17, 1968, with two boats from each Association. B.B.Y.R.A. Eliminations to be sailed in Finns at the Bay Head Yacht Club on July 10, 1968. Entries must reach William K. Dunbar, III, 56 North Street, Bay Head, N. J. by July 5, 1968.

ADAMS CUP. Finals to be sailed in Lightnings at the Bay Head Yacht Club, Bay Head, N. J., beginning Monday, August 26, 1968. Semi-Finals to be sailed in Lightnings at the Monmouth Boat Club in the Shrewsbury River under the auspices of the North Jersey Yacht Racing Association on August 7, 1968. B.B.Y.R.A. Eliminations to be sailed in Lightnings at the Metedeconk River Yacht Club on July 24, 1968. Entries must reach Roger K. Brown, 78 Sandy Island Drive, Brick Town, N. J., by July 17, 1968.

MALLORY CUP. Finals to be sailed in International Tempests at Richmond Yacht Club, San Francisco, California, with three man crew and no trapeze beginning Monday, August 26, 1968. Semi-Finals to be sailed in Lightnings at the Normandy Beach Yacht Club under the auspices of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association on August 7, 1968. B.B.Y.R.A. PRINCE OF WALES CUP. Finals to be sailed in Shields at the Los Angeles Yacht Club, Los Angeles, California, from August 26, to August 29, 1968. PRIZES

All season championship flags and trophies will be presented on the last day on the basis of B.B.Y.R.A. points for the season. A small B.B.Y.R.A. Flag similar to but smaller than the championship flag will be awarded to all qualifying yachts. Individual place pennants will be awarded for each regatta of the championship series.

Second place trophies and flags will be awarded to yachts in each regatta and the season championship when there are between four and six entries or qualifiers, as the case may be, and third place trophies and flags will be awarded to yachts in each regatta and the season championship when there are more than six entries or qualifiers, as the case may be.

The O. G. Dale Memorial Trophy (B.B.Y.R.A.) and the George R. Powell Trophy (S.P.Y.C.) may again be awarded at the end of the season in recognition of outstanding accomplishment as provided in their deeds of gift. The Chance Challenge Trophy may be presented to an "E" Sloop ten years or older with the best final standing.

The B.B.Y.R.A. Past Commodore Trophy will be presented to the member yacht club fostering the greatest participation in yacht racing on Barnegat Bay.
